## Competitors

The Junior European Cup is open to national teams of competitors not older than 20 years of age on December 31, 2015.

Sprint Classes: W18, M18, W20, M20 (max 6 competitors per nation in each class).

Long Distance: W18, M18, W20, M20 (max 6 competitors per nation in each class).

Relay Classes: Women, Men (max 4 relay teams per nation in each class).

A maximum of 4 staff members per nation is allowed.

There will be a separate classification for every race of the JEC 2015.

## National Team Scoring

A National Team score will be established based on the results of all three competitions as follows:

**Sprint and Long Distance:** the two best runners from each nation and each class will be counted.

The number of points earned equals the ranking (1st = 1 pt, 2nd = 2 pts, etc.). If a nation has only one or no runner in a class, the non-existent starts will be counted by taking the total number of starters in that class +1.

**Relay:** The best team for each nation, in each class, will be counted with its ranking multiplied by 6.

**Overall score:** The National Team with the lowest total after the three competitions wins and becomes Junior European Cup Team Champion 2015\*.

\* Runners from a non-European country may enter, but will not count in the scoring, however, they can be the daily individual winner.

## Accreditation

All registered teams must check in for accreditation at the JEC event office upon their arrival. Each registered team member must present her/his personal ID card/passport before she/he can be accredited. Please collect and present them for all members of the entire team together.

## Terrain descriptions

The competition area is situated at the northern rim of the Harz mountains between 350 and 650 m above sea level with steep slopes in the north and west. Especially in these parts plenty of stones and rocks occur. The runability in the mostly coniferous forest varies. During this summer a lot more undergrowth than usual came up.

## Clothes

Please abide by IOF rules (long trousers for Long Distance and Relay).  
The use of dobbs is not recommended for the Sprint.  
The use of spikes is not allowed

## Training maps

A model event (free order with flags) will be organized before JEC 2015. One map of this model event will be offered to every competitor and team leader. The maps will be available at the Event Centre.

## Punching system

Conventional SportIdent (Not SportIdent Air+) will be used. All SportIdent cards except SIAC1 (numbers > 8.000.000) can be used.

## Prize giving ceremonies

A flower ceremony will be held after the sprint. Prize giving ceremonies for Sprint and Long Distance will take place together on Saturday in the Kurhaus in Altenau.  
Relay and National Team Scoring ceremony will take place in the arena after the Relay.  
Please notice that all nations with potential top 3 runners should bring one or two extra national flags for the prize giving ceremonies.

## Insurance

Participation for staff and athletes at the Junior European Cup is at your own risk. Each National Team is responsible for their own valid insurance for travel, medical cover, etc.
